

## MR. H. J. ANDERS D E A D

At his home in Marshall, the spirit of Mr. H. J. Anders, known as Ben Anders, passed away at four o'clock Wednesday morning, September 2, 1925, age 66. Mr. Anders had been in poor health for about two years but was seriously ill only about 5 weeks, his stomach being the chief trouble. Funeral services were at the grave Thursday morning at ten o'clock conducted by his pastor, Rev. J. A. Martin, assisted by Rev. C. B. Newton, Rev. H. L. Smith, and Rev. Mr. Wallace of Asheville. Interment followed at the Station cemetery.

Mr. Anderson is survived by one brother, Mr. Bill Anders of Hartford, Tenn., and one sister, Mrs. Bill Allen of R-4. He is also survived by his wife and the following children: Will Anders and T. J. Anders of Marshall, John Anders of White Pine, Tenn., and four daughters—Mrs. W. F. Burris of R-2, Mrs. Ervin Candler, Mrs. John E. Rector and Mrs. Cal Creasman, the last three of Marshall R. F. D 1. All but Mrs. Creasman were present, she being kept away on account of sickness. Mr. Anders was a Mason, being a member of Jupiter Lodge, but on account of a misunderstanding as to the hour the lodge did not conduct the funeral. Mr. Anders was also a member of the Free Will Baptist church in which he had the office of deacon. He declared before his death that he was prepared to go, that he did not dread death and wished all his people and friends to meet him in the better land. During his last illness to every attention shown him he would say "That's all right." He bore his illness with patience and died easy, conscious unto the last.
