

FUNERAL OF MRS. D. M. AND-
ERSON.

As the last hours of the afternoon of October, 31, 1924, were slowly waning, a large crowd gathered at the Anderson burying grounds to pay the last tribute of respect to "Aunt Polly Anderson", wife of D. M. Anderson, who had preceded her to the grave about seventeen months.

Mrs. Anderson had been an invalid for a long time but was a kind patient, sweet Christian woman. Her lovely character was beautifully portrayed by Rev. J. M. Pickens, in charge of funeral services, who spoke of how kindly he had been treated by her when visiting the home while he was pastor of Paint Fork Church, some years ago.

"Aunt Polly" lived to be about seventy years of age and like the Psalmist of old, we feel like saying, "Precious in the sight of the Lord is the death of His Saints."
