C. G. BARRETT

Christopher G. Barrett was born November 1st, 1840; died October 24, 1929; age 88 years, 11 months, and 24 days. He was a native of Buncombe County and moved to Madison County in 1874. He was a soldier in the Union Army in the Civil War and was honorably discharged by the U. S. Government in April, 1865. He was married to Maggie Ball July 18, 1858, and to them were born seven children, two sons and five daughters, five of whom survive him, two daughters and his wife having preceded him to that Great Beyond. Those who survive him are Mrs. C. W. Church, Hot Springs, N. C.; Mrs. M. F. Plemmons, Leicester, N. C.; Elbert Barrett of Sandy Mush; Thomas Barrett of Sylva, N. C.; Mrs. G. A. Plemmons of Sandy Mush, and a host of grand-children, great and great-great-grandchildren to mourn their loss. He was converted and joined the Methodist church about 70 years ago. He was always kind and patient in his sufferings, faithful to Jesus, to his family, and to the church, and testified to the love of God in his heart in his dying hours. Though he has been very feeble for a long while, his death came with shocking swiftness. He was laid to rest by the side of his wife in the Little Sandy Mush Cemetery October 26, 1929. Rev. William Pless and Rev. Everett Sprinkle conducted the funeral services. The pallbearers were his grand-sons, and the flower girls were his grand-daughters.
