

FRANK BROWN DEAD ON SPRING CREEK

Mr. Frank Brown, age 60, after an illness of five weeks with typhoid fever, died at his home on Spring Creek about four o'clock Tuesday morning, September 13, 1932. Funeral services were from Lusk Chapel Baptist church at 11:00 o'clock Wednesday morning, conducted by the pastor, Rev. Horace Ferguson, interment following at the Woody cemetery. The pallbearers were Homer Reeves, Vergie Price, Floyd Askew, Campbell Askew, Eli Hipps, and John Hipps.
