

## DEATH OF MRS. LAURA BRYAN

On June 14, 1925, the Death Angel visited the home of Mr. Jasper Bryan and took from him his companion, Mrs. Laura Bryan. She had been sick for a long time, but at the time she died was thought to be better than she had been in six months.
