**Prominent Young Woman of
Marshall Laid to Rest

Marshall was very much shocked Monday to learn of the unexpected death of one of its best known young women, Mrs. Ezra Burnett. She had been taken to a hospital in Asheville a few days before, but the people of town had not expected anything but that she would be back within a reasonable time. Mrs. Burnett, age 28, was before her marriage Hope McLean, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. C. L. McLean of Marshall. She is survived by her husband, her parents, and three sisters, Miss Lace McLean, Miss Ruth McLean, and Miss Evelyn McLean. She was at one time a member of the Marshall school faculty and Mr. Burnett has been a member of the same faculty for several years.

Funeral services were Tuesday afternoon at the home at one o'clock and at the Madison Seminary at two o'clock, conducted by her pastor, the Rev. Hoyt Blackwell.
