

## Death of Henry A. Wallin

Madison County loses another of its best and most useful citizens in the death of Prof. Henry A. Wallin, Big Laurel, N. C., who died at the White Rock Hospital Sunday, March 14th, 1920, with appendicitis. Mr. Wallin had been sick about two weeks and was treated by Dr. Packard of White Rock. It was found that an operation was inevitable if his life was saved therefore he was moved to the hospital and Dr. Griffith of Asheville, and Dr. Roberts of Marshall were called and performed the operation about four or five days before his death. Everything done for him possible until Sunday morning at which time he died. Mr. Wallin was laid to rest Monday, March 15th, at 11 o'clock at the family graveyard at Big Laurel Seminary after appropriate services. Mr. Wallin married a Miss Cantrell about ten years ago who together with one daughter survive him also four brothers and one sister. The country has been greatly in the loss of the one who stood for progress and that was good. He was a contribution to every one around him to live better lives and make better citizens. He was a graduate of Wake Hill College, and Wake Forest College and was principal for two terms at Spring Creek Seminary, Principal at Mount Airy, N. C., and Wakefield College, S. C. and at Marshall, N. C. He was one of the best instructors in the State. The News Record has his wife and bereaved family sympathy.
